Overall purpose of role

To lead inspiring nature-based outdoor learning programmes for school groups, working with some or all of the following key stages: reception, KS1, KS2, KS3 science and KS5 biology.

Main responsibilities

- Leading excellent outdoor learning sessions for visiting school groups.
- Following programme outlines, adapting these for learners' needs, teacher requests, weather conditions and the outdoor environment.
- Setting up and packing away equipment.

Working conditions

Most delivery work will be outside, at Folly Farm education centre, with potential for working at other sites across Avon. Ideally candidates will be available for some evening work.
